C.25 Academic Forgiveness

Academic Matters Nunavut Arctic College

POLICY

Nunavut Arctic College will grant Academic Forgiveness to returning students wishing to make a fresh start.

GUIDELINES

- 1. Academic Forgiveness applies only to returning students who have an absence of three years from their program.
- 2. The relief is available regardless of the reason for the absence but is not automatic.

PROCEDURE

- 1. Students must complete a minimum of 24 credit hours of coursework if in a degree program or nine credit hours if in a diploma program with a grade point average of 2.0 before they are eligible to apply for Academic Forgiveness.
- 2. Application must be made in writing to the Registrar's Office.
- 3. Academic Forgiveness will affect the student's cumulative grade point average in all courses taken prior to the minimum absence.
- 4. A student can have the Academic Forgiveness policy applied to his or her academic record only one time.
- 5. With the approval of the Registrar, in consultation with the Dean or Senior Officer, the student will be granted Academic Forgiveness.
- 6. The student's transcript will remain a record of all coursework completed and original grades obtained but courses taken prior to the three year absence will not be used in computing the student's cumulative grade point average.
- 7. Students will be eligible to retain credit for courses in which they obtained a passing grade.
- 8. Students will be required to complete at least half the credits required for the academic program following Academic Forgiveness before they will be able to graduate.
